2. CADCA National Academy in Tucson – Alicia

Alicia Philips Reported: She attended the first week of the CADCA National Academy in Tucson. There are approximately 30 or more attendees. Week 1 attendees learn to write a Community Assessment and a logic model. She will continue to be working with communities and school through this process. The Academy is a three week commitment, Debe Campbell and Alicia felt for Year 4 of the grant work will continue to be done educating the community, school, and parents on legalization of recreational marijuana. The next academy will be the second week May. She emphasized the need to have the Steering Committee to engage more with us as we move into the future.

- 4. Collaboration with Whiteriver Housing Authority Debe

Debe Campbell Reported: We were contacted by the Whiteriver Housing Authority, they asked us to participate in a forum on Meth. HUD builds the homes on the reservation, and the Meth has gotten so bad it is creating a big clean up problem with the homes that are exposed to this substance. The cost to repair a home is anywhere between \$3,000.00 - \$10,000.00 for clean-up. What we offered to them was a DFC Mentoring Grant. We will be working with them on the grant. To be a part of their help we have to set up the grant and get a commitment to be advisors which would meet once a quarter. Alicia and I would be meeting twice a month with the group. We are very excited to be invited.

5. Underage Drinking Town Hall April 28th 6:00 – 7:30 pm

Alicia Reports: Show Low High School will discuss Teen Court. Chief Shelly and Detective Uhall will present on the consequences on social hosting .Blue Ridge High School with be speaking about on SADD and Mpowrd.
