My name is Dan Webb and I am a detective with the Arizona Department of Liquor. I have been a law enforcement officer since 2002, and worked patrol for 10 years of my career. I have worked several details during my career, which include; field training officer, field training program coordinator, commercial truck enforcement officer, high-risk stop instructor, general instructor, liquor law instructor, fake ID recognition instructor, trained grant writer, and prevention coordinator. In 2014, I obtained my M.B.A. with a 3.9 GPA and continue my education through professional training opportunities as they occur.

In regards to my current role as a prevention coordinator: I am the sole police officer in the State of Arizona funded by the Governor's Office of Youth, Faith and Family. My duties include; trainings for youth in regards to the dangers of underage drinking, prevention coordination efforts with coalitions around the State, assisting communities enact a social host ordinance, interacting with communities at community events, safety fairs and drug awareness walks, and creating informational handouts to further educate the public.

The Arizona High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area (HIDTA) was established in 1990 as part of the Southwest Border HIDTA, which includes California, New Mexico, and Texas.

The Arizona HIDTA's mission is to facilitate, support, and enhance collaborative drug control efforts among law enforcement agencies and community-based organizations with a common voice and unified strategy and thereby significantly reduce the impact of illegal trafficking and use of drugs throughout Arizona.

By focusing on this mission, the Arizona HIDTA has evolved into a trusted counter-drug grant program that Arizona law enforcement agencies have come to rely upon to assess regional drug threats, facilitate the creation of cooperative strategies to address the threat, and to provide them with the necessary resources to enhance their effectiveness and efficiency as they implement the strategies.

The Arizona HIDTA coordinates and supports the efforts of 574 full-time and 227 part-time participants from 70 Federal, state, local, and tribal agencies.
