**Attorney General's Drug Endangered Child Program (DEC)
 (Formerly known as METH & KIDS)**

Methamphetamine is the number one illegal drug contributing to violent crime in Arizona. Not only is "meth" highly addictive, it is easily and cheaply produced using common household chemicals and over the counter cold medicines. The manufacturing process is very dangerous. Because the chemicals used are highly flammable, fires and explosions that result in serious injury or death are not uncommon. In fact, the high

number of incidents in which individuals have been hurt or killed prompted Attorney General Terry Goddard to promote legislation to enhance State laws to give prosecutors the ability to go after violators who cook meth near children and vulnerable adults. The Attorney General's Office worked with State and local agencies to develop a protocol for officers and emergency personnel to follow when called to the scene of a meth lab where children are present. This includes contact with Child Protective Services, hospitals, pediatric specialists and others to determine the extent of the child's exposure to chemical fumes. Because methamphetamine has only recently become a popular drug, the long-term effects the fumes have on children are unknown.
